

L. Todd Wood

L. Todd Wood is a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He has been an aeronautical engineer and an Air Force pilot, and flew for the 20th Special Operations Squadron that started Desert Storm. In 1991 to 1994 he was active in classified missions in support of counterterrorism under the control of the National Command Authority and deployed throughout the world. In 1994 Todd joined an investment bank. During this second career he became highly knowledgeable in Emerging Markets Fixed Income and traveled a great deal internationally with a focus on the Caribbean. He became acutely aware of the consequences of economic decisions and their effect on national and economic security.

Ellen Brown

Ellen Brown developed her research skills as an attorney practicing civil litigation in Los Angeles. In Web of Debt, her latest book, she turns those skills to an analysis of the Federal Reserve and "the money trust." She shows how this private cartel has usurped the power to create money from the people themselves, and how we the people can get it back. Brown developed an interest in the developing world and its problems while living abroad for eleven years in Kenya, Honduras, Guatemala and Nicaragua. She returned to practicing law when she was asked to join the legal team of a popular Tijuana healer with an innovative cancer therapy, who was targeted by the chemotherapy industry in the 199

Gene Epstein

Gene Epstein, an economist of the Austrian School--and by political persuasion a libertarian--joined Barron's in February 1992 as Commodities Editor. The following year, he became the weekly's first Economics Editor and the first to write the column, "Economic Beat"-- his responsibility to this day. In October 2010, he also became the Barron's Book Review Editor. Before joining Barron's, Epstein did a 13-year stint at the New York Stock Exchange, mainly as a senior economist. He has taught economics at the City University of New York and St. John's University and holds an M.A. in the subject from the New School and a B.A. in history from Brandeis University.
