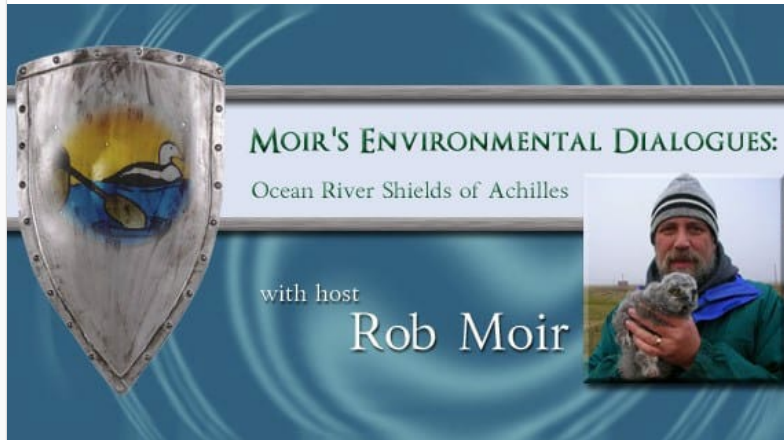

October 30th 2014: Special Encore Presentation: Quelling the Storm at Sea and the Ocean View from Lazy Point

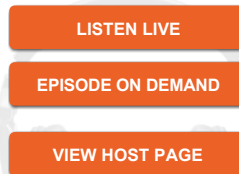
