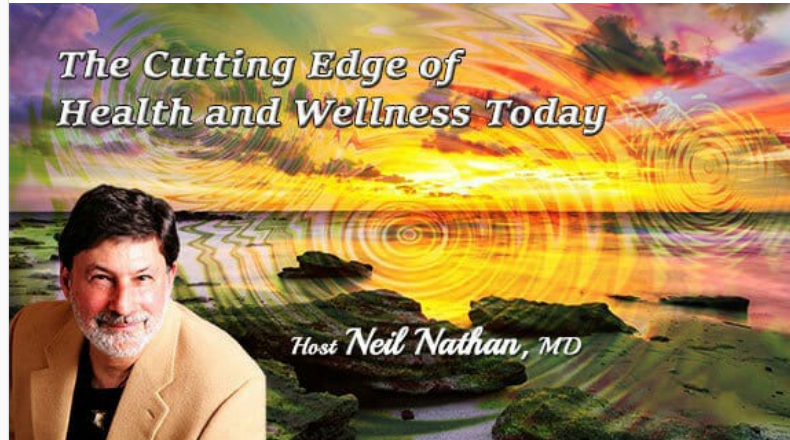


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May 01st 2015: Gulf War Illness: New Understandings of this underappreciated problem
